

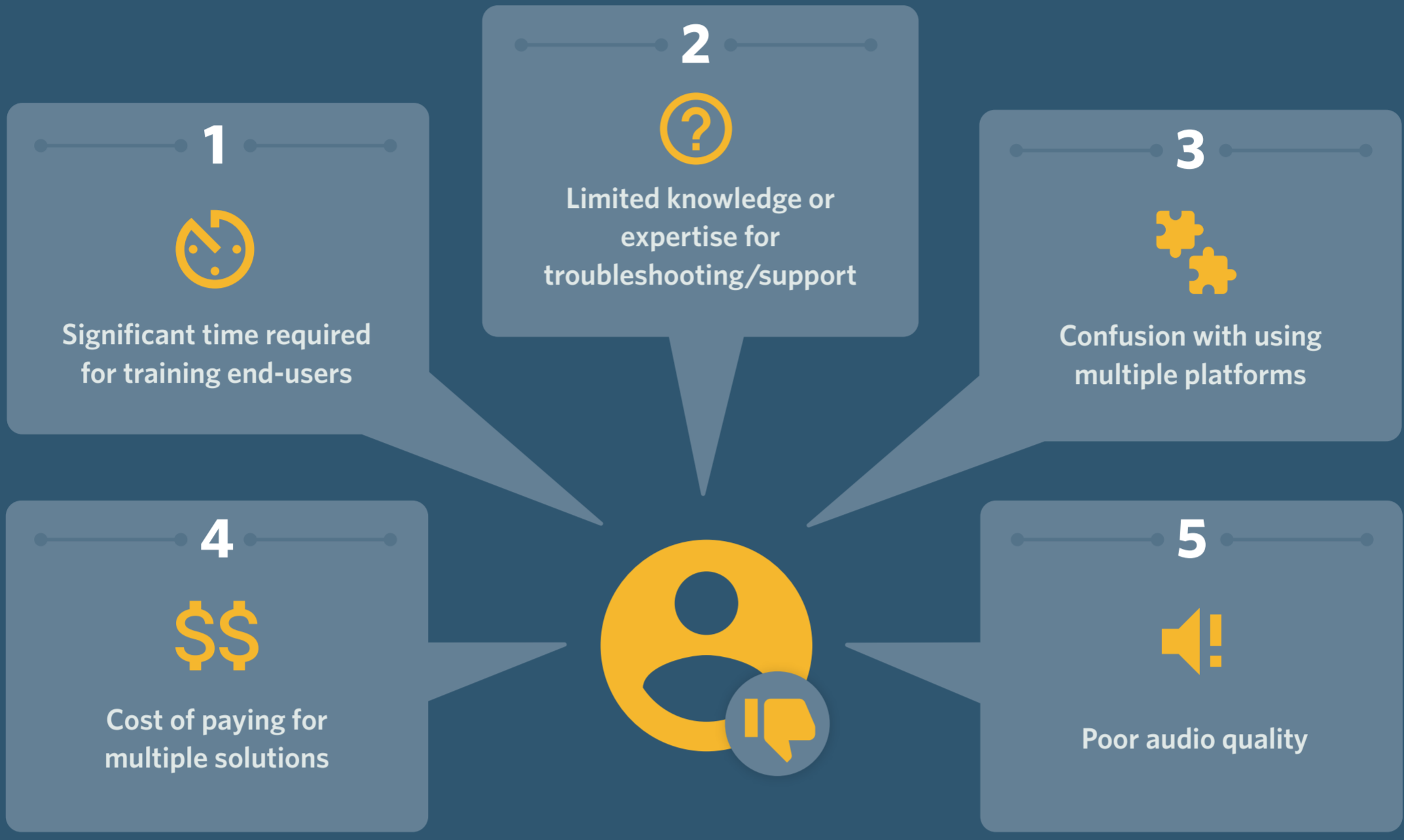
IT Pros Speak Up about UNIFIED COMMUNICATIONS

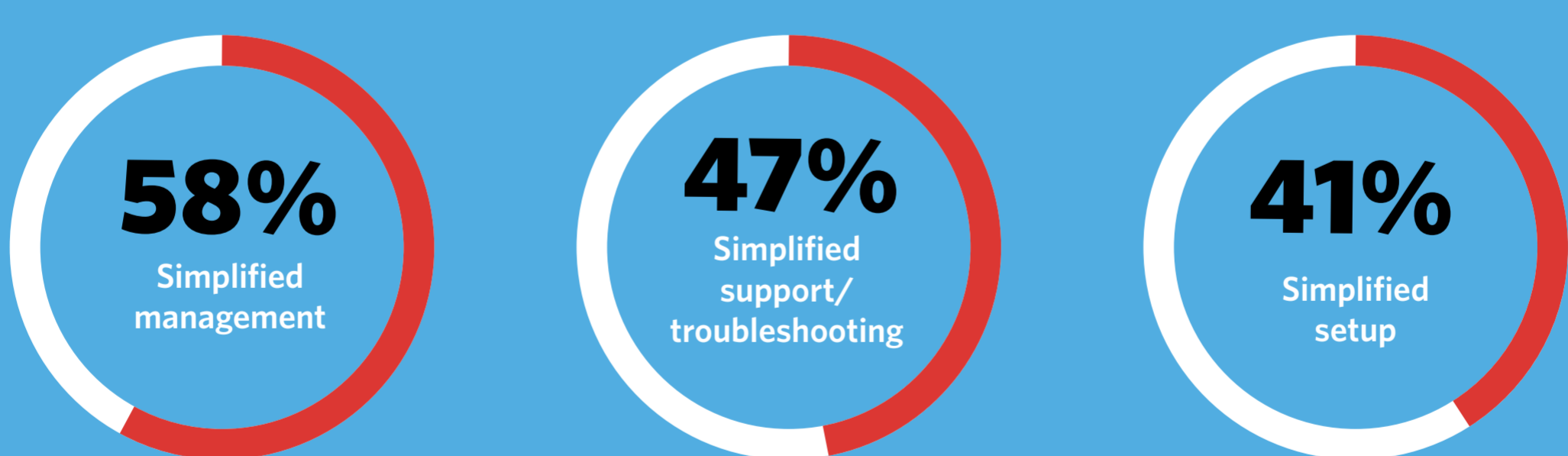
